





- Registration will open tomorrow
 September 21st

- Note: Minimum of 40 students needed for trip. Max of 48 students on the first bus. After 48 registrations we will begin a waitlist (no fee). Need 80 registrations for a second bus.
- Please note, if you register after October 29, we cannot guarantee that you will be able to enter the White House, Capitol, or Pentagon. For security reasons, we must submit our roster in advance and have been told that any late additions will not be guaranteed approval, though we will of course try.

COVID MEASURES

- COVID protocols will be determined and shared at the pre-trip meeting in April. Known measures at this time may include any of the following
 - Masks optional/required/needed only if required by venue
 - Proof of vaccination emailed to chaperones and on phone
 - Testing leading up to departure day





SCHOLARSHIPS
